

### **115.222 Policies to ensure referrals of allegations for investigations.**

- (a) The Salvation Army will ensure that an administrative or criminal investigation is completed for all allegations of sexual abuse and sexual harassment by contacting the Asheville Police Department for criminal investigations and the BOP for administrative & criminal investigations.
- (b) The Salvation Army will have in place a policy to ensure that allegations of sexual abuse or sexual harassment are referred for investigation to the Asheville Police Department and the BOP with the legal authority to conduct criminal investigations, unless the allegation does not involve potentially criminal behavior.
- (c) The Asheville Police Department and the BOP is responsible for conducting criminal investigations
- (d) The Federal Bureau of prisons is responsible for conducting administrative or criminal investigations of sexual abuse or sexual harassment at The Salvation Army.
- (e) The Asheville Police Department and The Federal Bureau of prisons is responsible for conducting administrative or criminal investigations of sexual abuse or sexual harassment at the Salvation Army and has an agreement governing the conduct of such investigations.

### **115.254 Third-party reporting.**

The Salvation Army will hand out brochures and contact information on a way for residents to receive third-party reports of sexual abuse and sexual harassment and will distribute publicly information on bulletin boards on how to report sexual abuse and sexual harassment on behalf of a resident.

### **115.288 Data review for corrective action.**

- (a) The Salvation Army will review data collected and aggregated pursuant to § 115.287 in order to assess and improve the effectiveness of its sexual abuse prevention, detection, and response policies, practices, and training, including:
  - (1) Identifying problem areas;
  - (2) Taking corrective action on an ongoing basis; and
  - (3) Preparing an annual report of its findings and corrective actions for the Salvation Army
- (b) Such report shall include a comparison of the current year's data and corrective actions with those from prior years and shall provide an assessment of The Salvation Army's progress in addressing sexual abuse.
- (c) The Salvation Army's report shall be approved by the BOP and made readily available to the public through its website or, if it does not have one, through other means.
- (d) The Salvation Army may redact specific material from the reports when publication would present a clear and specific threat to the safety and security of a Salvation Army, but must indicate the nature of the material redacted.

**115.289 Data storage, publication, and destruction.**

(a) The Salvation Army shall ensure that data collected pursuant to § 115.287 are securely retained.

(b) The Salvation Army shall make all aggregated sexual abuse data, from facilities under its direct control and private facilities with which it contracts, readily available to the public at least annually through its website or, if it does not have one, through other means.

(c) Before making aggregated sexual abuse data publicly available, The Salvation Army shall remove all personal identifiers.

(d) The Salvation Army shall maintain sexual abuse data collected pursuant to § 115.287 for at least 10 years after the date of the initial collection unless Federal, State, or local law requires otherwise.
